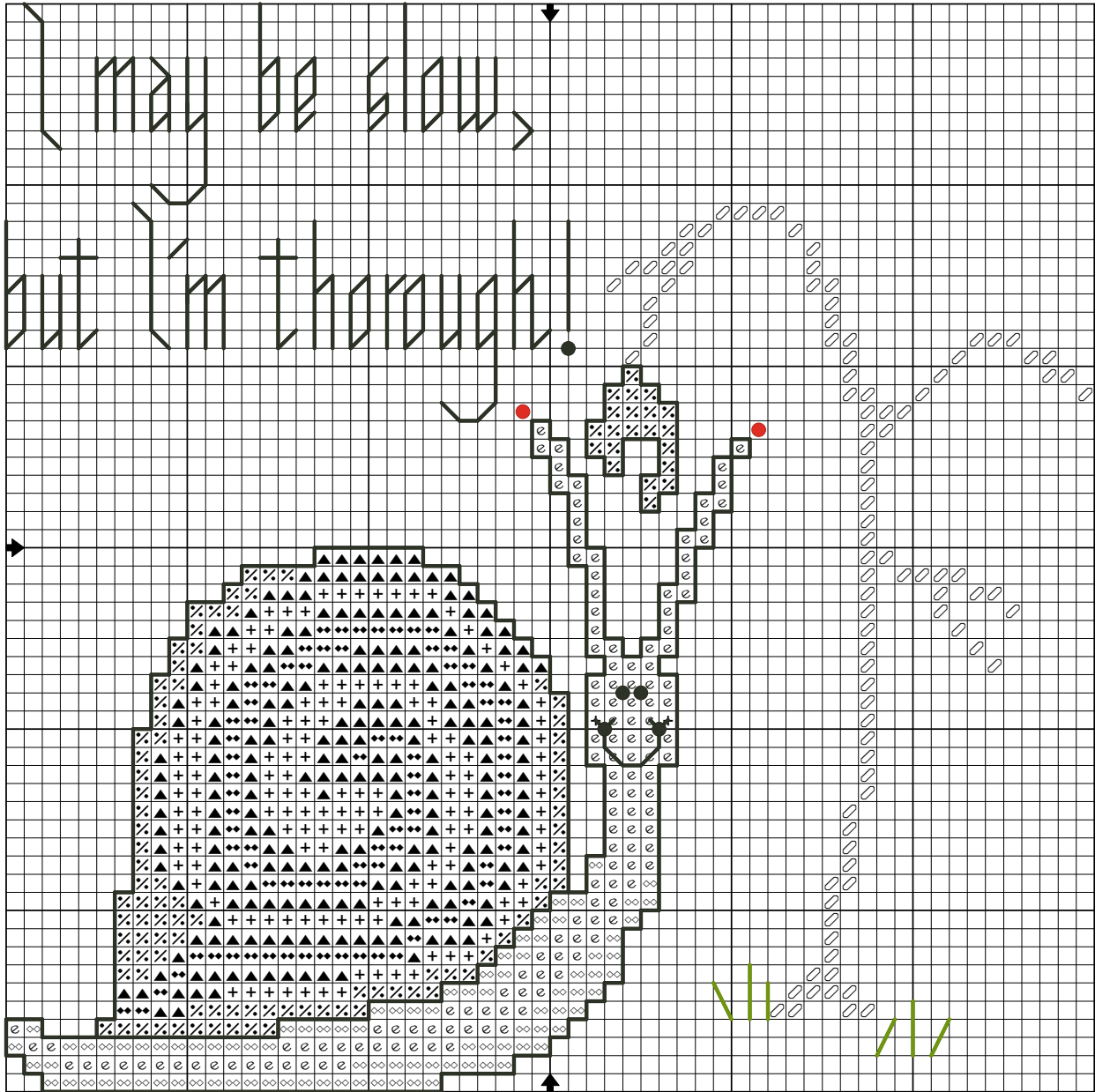

## Floss Chart

X	DMC	Anchor	Color
	301	1049	Mahogany-MD
	606	334	Bright Orange-Red
	581	280	Moss Green
	434	310	Brown-LT
	580	281	Moss Green-DK
	166	279	Moss Green-MD LT
	400	351	Mahogany-DK

Lettering and snail outline: Use one strand DMC 310, Black, or Anchor 403, black. The snail's antennae are topped with a French knot of two strands of DMC 606 or Anchor 334. What's left of the grass is two strands of straight stitched DMC 581 or Anchor 280.

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**Fabric:** Charles Craft 14 count Fiddler Lite.

**Stitch Count:** 60w x 60h

**Finished size:** 4-1/4"w x 4-1/4"h

Just in time for Spring gardening, my little guy is the only snail you'll want to see!

**Note:** Fabric is just a suggestion. Perhaps you have a small leftover piece of 14 count fabric, or 28 count linen you can stitch over two threads you can use. Thread colors are suggested, but you could even try variegated or overdyed floss.

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
